The climax of the day was enjoying a meal together with the children. Although We were overwhelmed with the large turnout, God’s faithfulness was evident. Many of the unchurched children attended. ROUTINE SUNDAY BIBLE STUDY

Over 200 children attend our church. We have 4 teachers who pray, plan and prepare each week to minister to them every Sunday. We have toddlers, juniors, and teens classes. We studied the life of David (1Samuel 15-20; 2Samuel 4-9) in April and Joshua (Joshua 1-8) in May. The month of June, we are doing Elijah (1 Kings 18-19). CWK has been helpful training our teachers and providing bible study materials. We have weekly outreach programs for children and families who don’t go to church. Although great improvement, children programs are yet to get enough support in our local churches. Please pray for the work we are doing and divine favour with church leadership.



TEACHERS TRAINING WORKSHOP

Our 4th training was at Bible way Church, Mumias – Western Kenya. Among the 31 trainees were the Bishop and National Children Director. The Bishop lauded CWK for good work and emphasized the need of research on current trends to make the teachings more relevant. We were encouraged to have a pastor from one of the churches. For a while, we have been thinking of enhancing our ministry in the church. Starting a school sounded a far-fetched idea considering the finances required. But we trusted God and we started a pre-school at the church opening its doors to 24 pioneer admissions on January 4, 2019 for PP1, PP2 and Grade 1. At Flavour Christian School (FCS), we do Bible study and pray with children every morning before starting their normal classes. We have more classrooms
